After the 2022 trip bore an unforgettable offshore adventure to Fiji's islands and with a little encouragement from family, my son Gray, son-in-law Dan, and their fishing buddies, who couldn't resist the call of game fishing after the last trip via Minerva Reef. So, on June 1st 2024, we set off from Marsden Cove as a flotilla of seven vessels, all bound for the sunny shores of Fiji.

The weather was as kind as the forecast promised, giving us smooth sailing on the four-day journey to Minerva Reef. There, the game fishing did not disappoint—plenty of catches, with most released and a few kept for sashimi feasts. However, a surprise visit from the Fiji Navy and a Customs Officer had us hastily moving on, citing rules that required a direct route to our destination. We set off for Denarau, while the Navy sailed to the Lau Group, where they ironically grounded their new A\$30 million vessel at Vulaga Reef—a mishap reminiscent of New Zealand's own NZ\$100 million Manawai loss in the Solomon Islands.


We arrived at Port Denarau on June 10th to meet my daughter Shana and my two grandsons. After a quick restock and refuel, it was time to explore the stunning Yasawa Islands.

June through August in Fiji is pure bliss, and this trip was no exception. We discovered incredible new snorkelling spots, swam with manta rays, and enjoyed the hospitality of local resorts. With rotating groups of friends and families joining the flotilla, there was no shortage of laughter and adventure.

There were only minor hiccups along the way, like the issues on Cool Change, intercooler problems, and apparently an unstable bread maker which Barry (skipper) "had to lay on the galley floor"!? A matter of considerable speculation over the radio

As August approached, and with cyclone season looming, it was time to head back. The journey home was a bit rough at first, so we opted for a direct five-day passage. A quick stop at an underwater sea mount (a mere 30 meters deep) allowed us to snag some fresh Wahoo. We cleared Customs at Marsden Cove, continued to journey home where my wife Linda and I enjoyed one last night at Great Mercury Island, and finally made it back to Whitianga Waterways, safe and sound.

Coromandel, 4RPH+V5, Hahei 3591



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Christmas Gingerbread Cookies

with White Chocolate Icing

RECIPE SHANA HOPPER-MCCULLY

INGREDIENTS

Cookies:

125g butter
1/3 cup (75g) firmly packed
brown sugar
½ cup (175g) golden syrup
3 cups (450g) plain flour
4 tsp ground ginger
4 tsp ground cinnamon
1 tsp ground clove
2 tsp bicarbonate of soda
1 egg, beaten lightly

1 tsp vanilla extract

lcing:

250g white chocolate melts 3/4 - 1 cup icing sugar Food colouring (any colour of your choice) M&M's / Sprinkles Hot water

COOKIES METHOD

- 1. Preheat oven to 160'C fan-bake. Lay baking paper on trays.
- 2. Heat butter, sugar and golden syrup in small microwave-safe bowl, uncovered on high in microwave for about 1 minute or until butter has melted. Let mixture cool for 5 minutes.
- 3. Sift combined flour, spices and soda into large bowl; add butter mixture, egg and extract, stir with wooden spoon until
- 4. Divide dough in half, knead each portion of dough on floured surface. Using rolling pin, roll dough out into 5mm thickness. Using gingerbread cookie cutters, cut out shapes and place on oven travs.
- 5. Bake gingerbread cookies for about 10-12 minutes or until golden brown. Cool on trays.
- 6. Make icing and decorate cookies.

WHITE CHOCOLATE METHOD

- 1. Fill a pot with shallow water and bring to boil over stove. Place a heatproof dish inside the pot, over the hot water.
- 2. Inside the heatproof dish, place white chocolate in to melt. Stir regularly until fully melted.
- 3. Once melted, take the pot off the heat and slowly stir in a tablespoon of icing sugar, one at a time, until the mixture becomes thick to icing consistency. (a) If the mixture becomes too thick and dry, add a small teaspoon of hot water while mixing and continue this until you achieve the right thick consistency for icing.
- 4. Once you have your icing consistency right, separate your icing into even amounts and add your chosen food colouring and mix. Repeat 3(a) if your mixture becomes dry.
- 5. Place your icing into piping bags, if you do not have piping bags, you can use plastic sandwich bags and cut the corner ends to pipe the icing.
- 6. Decorate your cookies with the icing and M&M's. Wait a few minutes to let the icing set before you eat. Enjoy!

As children from the tiny Channel Island of Guernsey, Wilson, Clifford and Leslie Green were forced to evacuate their homes during World War II amid the German occupation. The separation would last more than five years but forged an irreplicable bond that extended to their family lives in New Zealand.

In 1955. Wilson and Clifford traded one island for another. leaving Guernsey, no larger than Lake Rotorua, for New Zealand's North Island. Before his departure, Clifford had met Marlene - a local Guernsey girl - who joined him abroad. This was followed by the third Green brother - Leslie.

Their shared journey set the stage for each to find love and establish roots in their new homeland. Clifford married Marlene in 1959, while Wilson met and married Taumarunui native Deb later that same year.

The last to join the family Green was Maureen, a sporty girl from Whangarei, who met her husband Leslie through badminton, where they both excelled as regional representatives. This

made their home in Browns Bay. Following Leslie's passing, Maureen moved to a Hopper-built home in Orewa. Marlene and Clifford also found their place in the community, where they ran the cherished Orewa Menswear store for

The Green brothers' bond, forged in the crucible of war and deepened by their shared migration, found a parallel in the close-knit relationships between their wives. From raising their children to sadly bidding farewell to their husbands, each woman has led a vibrant and remarkable life, now continuing together at Maygrove Village.


